**THE BIBLE AND THE TV REMOTE:** On the coffee table in the family room sits the TV Remote. High on the shelf in the family room sits the Holy Bible. One is dust free and the other has a coating of dust on it. (Sorry, it's not the Bible but the TV Remote.) One is used constantly and when misplaced causes panic. The other is seldom, if ever used, and many people can't remember where it is at. (Again, it's not the Bible.) Many open the TV with their TV Remote to escape their daily grind, but few open and read their Bible to find answers, comfort and peace.

The Word of God for many is seldom read, but watching TV is a must. No time for prayer, no time for the Word; the Good News of Salvation in Jesus Christ is never heard. Forgiveness of sin so full and free is found in the Bible and not seen on TV.

**CATHEDRAL EARLY LEARNING CENTER:** Our preschool is accepting applications for the 2020-2021 school year. To enroll for the two day class (Tuesday & Thursday), the child must be 3 years old before August 1<sup>st</sup>. To enroll for the three day class (Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday – please note day change for this class), the child must be 4 years old before August 1<sup>st</sup>. Applications are available in the church office. Registration fee is \$50 per child, and activity fee of \$75 per child. Tuition for two-day class is \$145 a month and \$175 a month for the three-day class. Children must be toilet trained to be enrolled. Call Christine Chimitris, 219-769-2481, between 9:00-11:30 a.m. for details.

**FOOD PANTRY:** The call to remember the hungry and needy of the world is a continuous call by our Lord Jesus Christ. Donations of pasta, spaghetti sauce, peanut butter, canned meats, canned tuna, canned fruits, canned vegetables, dry beans, and lentils are all needed. Other things needed are personal hygiene items, shampoo, toothpaste, cleaning products, hand soap, dish soap, toilet paper and other paper goods. Cash donations are welcomed.

At this time, the Food Pantry will remain open on Fridays from 9:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m. However, instead of our regular parishioner crew working it, volunteers from the Ross Township office will. Anyone 18-40 without any medical conditions who would like to volunteer and work during these times is asked to contact Karen Petalas at the Township Office or Patty Makarounas through the church office. (Note: there is no Bible Study this week because of Vespers.)

**ORTHODOX STUDY HOUR:** Fr. Dimitri has been hosting virtual Orthodox Religious Education for our parish in the evenings during the week. Anyone interested in the Tuesday Bible Study at 7:00pm on the book of Genesis or the Thursday Faith 101 class at 7:00pm on the Divine Liturgy may tune in via Zoom. Both classes are posted on our Facebook Page the day after. For further details, contact Fr. Dimitri through the church office.

**PARISH COUNCIL OPENINGS:** Due to two resignations from the Parish Council, there are two open seats available. Any parishioner 18 years or older in good standing with the church (canonically & financially) is welcomed to submit their name, co-sponsored by two parishioners, to Fr. Ted at the church office.

**YOUTH WORKERS NEEDED:** Anyone interested in helping our clergy and the Youth Committee coordinate and organize our various youth programs and ministries for next year (beginning this fall) is asked to contact Fr. Ted or Fr. Dimitri at the church office. We need at least two advisors for each of our HOPE, JOY, Jr. GOYA, & GOYA groups, one altar boy supervisor, 18 Sunday school teachers and substitutes, at least 4 retreat leaders for our fall, winter, spring and summer retreats. Without parishioner support, especially our youth's parents, we cannot continue our various programs. Please offer your time and talent. Also keep in mind, anyone working with the youth must participate in the Archdiocese Youth Protection Program. ## ATTENTION FAITHFUL MEMBERS OF SAINTS CONSTANTINE AND HELEN CATHEDRAL

We have spent the days since the COVID-19 Pandemic swept the nation and world unable to gather as a church family for prayer, worship, and the reception of the sacraments. Through these difficult months, we have devoted ourselves to fervent prayer and entreaty to God for those sick with the virus, for frontline workers, for our civil and church leaders, and so that we could once again be united to our church family.

We now have the church doors open for church services, with limited seating after months of being closed. That being said, the experience of coming to church is different. There are new requirements and procedures put in place to allow us to celebrate the Divine Liturgy as safely as possible.

Below is a list of these new protocols. Please read them over carefully. A greater familiarity with these protocols will result in an easier transition to the new worship experience at our Cathedral. Please understand that these protocols are subject to change, and we will do our best to keep you updated.

We thank you for your continued patience and prayer, and ask for your assistance and cooperation as we open up our church.

### OUTLINE OF SAFETY PROTOCOLS BEFORE ATTENDING CHURCH

- The church (or areas used for worship) will be sanitized before each service.
- The church will only be allowed to hold as many people (100-150) as can maintain social distancing (6 feet distance).
- Due to the limited seating available, every person who is planning on attending worship services will need to register through the church office (219-769-2481) between 11am-1pm, Monday through Friday. Registration will be on a first-come, first-served basis. This will allow us to ensure that we can accommodate everyone. Those who come to church without registering will not be allowed to enter.
- According to the directives of the Metropolis of Chicago, the high-risk population and those caring for them should not attend services. Our parish will be using a system of self-reporting. We will not be verifying your age or medical history at the door.
- Those who have tested positive for COVID-19, or who are in the same household as someone positive for COVID-19, or who are feeling sick should not attend services.
- Worship Services will continue to be lived streamed on our Cathedral's Facebook Page and You Tube Channel for those who cannot or may not feel safe to attend.

### COMING TO CHURCH

- Every person attending worship will need to check in upon arrival at the designated area in the Exo-Narthex. There will be a brief screening process (verbal questions and a temperature check) at the sign-in table.
- Every attendee will need to wear masks (you must provide your own mask) at all times while they are in the physical area of worship, except when receiving Holy Communion. The only exception will be small children.
- Use non-contact greetings (waving, a bowing of the head) with fellow parishioners instead of the traditional hugging, kissing or shaking of hands. Social distancing must be maintained. No walking about the church proper to greet, talk or visit with one another.

### IN THE CHURCH

- There will be hand sanitizer stations at the entry of the church, at the candle stands, at the entry into the Nave, and at the Solea.

- There will be no veneration (kissing) of icons, sacred objects, or the priest's hand.
- Parish Council members will distribute candles for the faithful to light, as well as place the 3-hour votives and 5-day red votives in there designated areas of the church. After lighting candles you will be asked to sanitize your hands before entering the Nave of the church.
- No paper bulletins, monthly newsletters or other items will be distributed to those attending worship.
- Due to the need to socially distance, a Parish Council member or a designated usher will escort you to your seat. Please do not insist on sitting in "your spot," as the Parish Council's only concern will be in maintaining social distancing to maximize safety.
- Every other pew will be available for seating with six feet in between each worshiper. People living in the same household can sit together.
- There will be no liturgical books in the pews.
- There will be no distribution of antidoron, artoklasia or kolyva.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy. The Parish Council will direct people to approach the Chalice and observe social distancing. Sanitize your hands before approaching the Chalice (sanitizer stations will be available on the Solea).
- After receiving Holy Communion, families will depart directly from the side doors and go to their cars to return home. Please do not congregate in the parking lot.
- The church and other worship areas will be sanitized again after services conclude.

#### Please remember:

**It is YOUR CHOICE whether to ATTEND CHURCH or not.  
It is YOUR CHOICE whether to RECEIVE Holy Communion or not.  
DO NOT BE JUDGMENTAL of those who do or don't.**

All unsold tickets, ticket stubs and money collected are returned to the church office no later than Friday, November 6<sup>th</sup>. Your cooperation in this matter is truly appreciated!

**BYZANTINE MUSIC CLASS:** This fall, our parish will be holding a Byzantine Music class led by Fr. Dimitri for those who would like to learn the ancient art of Orthodox Church music. **STEWARDSHIP NEWS:** This year, instead of the warm days of summer providing excuses for not attending church services, it's the COVID-19 pandemic. Whether the church is filled or not, the monthly expense of \$85,000 continues. **Please remain current with your pledge payments over the summer!** At this time, all 2020 pledges should be at least half way paid. Second quarter Statements of Financial Contribution have been mailed out. Please review your statement to see if it is correct. If there is a problem with your statement or if you cannot make your payments, contact the church office.

Remember, your parish worship services as well as the programs and ministries we offer, though affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic, are still active and being ministered by our clergy and volunteers. Their effectiveness in serving the needs of our faithful are only as fruitful as you make them with your time, effort, and support. If you don't care, who really will?

If you haven't submitted your 2020 Pledge to our Cathedral, please do so today! Also, remember Ss. Constantine and Helen this summer. Keep current with your pledge by submitting your payment before you leave on vacation. Statements of Contribution will be mailed out shortly for you to review and check to see where you stand in regards to your Stewardship Pledge. Your unending support is necessary to continue the ministries and programs of our parish. Thank you for your support and cooperation in this matter!

Every parishioner should be a supporting member, a steward, of our Cathedral. Everyone should contribute what they can. **WHO DO WE SAY THAT JESUS CHRIST IS?** Today's Gospel lesson (Matthew 9:27-35) confronts us with our Lord's healing of the two blind men and deliverance of someone who is possessed by demons. As in several places in the gospel, we are given two different identities for Jesus Christ:

1. The Son of David – the anointed one who came to heal the brokenhearted, to free the captives, to give sight to the blind, and to bring forth the Kingdom of Heaven (Isaiah 49).
2. Someone who is not God. In this case Jesus was accused by the Pharisees of being Satan.

Just like the blind men and all others who have been transformed by Jesus Christ, we know that He is truly the Son of God. And like the devil who the Pharisees accused Jesus as being associated with, we know that whatever is not of God is divided, and it is when we cooperate with Him that we are living for His life and glory.

**SAINT OF THE DAY – PARASKEVI THE GREAT MARTYR:** How much should one be expected to suffer for Christ? If we look at the life of the Righteous Paraskevi and a countless number of other saints, the answer is simply: "As much as is necessary."

Paraskevi was born in Rome in the 2<sup>nd</sup> century. The name "Paraskevi" literally means "Friday", the day the saintly woman was born – the answer to many years of fervent prayer offered to God by her parents. Paraskevi was given the best education and spiritual training by them. When they died, she followed the Gospel command of our Lord to "...sell what you have and give it to the poor" (Matthew 19:21). Paraskevi gave away all of her possessions and became a nun, preaching the message of the Lord with great fervor.

As was often the case during this time of great persecution for the Church, Paraskevi's outspoken zeal caused her to be arrested and put on trial before the Roman authorities. The Emperor Antoninus inflicted terrible tortures upon her. One torture was that he had Paraskevi placed in a cauldron of boiling oil, and like the three holy youth of Babylon, instead of burning her it seemed to cool her. The emperor asked Paraskevi to sprinkle him, to convince him it wasn't an illusion. She cupped her hands with oil and splashed his face, and he was blinded. The emperor called upon her God to be healed and he was. Antoninus believed and was baptized.

Paraskevi, being freed, left Rome and continued to preach in the Name of Jesus Christ. She was arrested two more times in other cities, where she faced great tortures again, and was delivered from her persecutors! When her pagan adversaries attempted to credit their Gods with protecting her, Paraskevi replied, "It is not your gods who heal me, but my Christ, the true God."

Ultimately, Paraskevi suffered death by beheading. She prayed, and Jesus' voice was heard to answer her prayer before her martyrdom. The Greek Orthodox Church celebrates the Feast Day of St. Paraskevi on July 26<sup>th</sup>. St. Paraskevi is considered the Patron Saint for the blind and those with vision difficulties.

**DEKAPENTAVGousto:** In honor of the Virgin Mary, the Greek Orthodox Church designates the first fifteen days of August to commemorate her falling asleep (Koimisis) in the Lord. The prayer service of the Paraklesis is conducted during this period. Paraklesis Services will be chanted in our parish at 6:30 p.m. on the following evenings: August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> in the Cathedral. Wednesday, August 5<sup>th</sup>, the Vespers Service for the Transfiguration of our Lord will be chanted at 6:30 p.m., also in the Cathedral. Names of the living are commemorated at the Paraklesis service. Please submit names to be commemorated for health and well-being, along with a donation for the needy, to the altar prior to the start of the service.
